I am writing to you on behalf of Ada County Drainage District No. 2 (hereinafter "Drainage District") which owns, operates and maintains the drainage ditch and the easement therefore to maintain said drain in the vicinity in which the Pierce Park Neighborhood Association has proposed a connectivity pathway. The Drainage District would like to express its general support for the Pierce Park Neighborhood Connectivity Pathway grant proposal. We wish the Pierce Park Neighborhood Association the best of luck in securing funding from the City. The Drainage District understands this letter of support allows the pathway project to move toward design if funded.

The Drainage District will require a License Agreement to the extent the proposed pathway encroaches within the Drainage District's easement for the drain and to provide in part that the Drainage District is not responsible for the maintenance of the pathway and that the pathway in no way interferes with the Drainage District's access to the drain. By the way, the Drainage District's easement for open drains such as the one in question is 100 feet, 50 feet to either side of the centerline. That said, the Drainage District is willing to work with the Pierce Park Neighborhood Association and City of Boise to explore proposed plans and construction of the pathway.
